

## Assignment No. 14

There is no word limit/requirement for these exercises. Your responses may be in English, French, Spanish, German, Arabic, or any other language you are comfortable writing in. The grammar, spelling, and prescriptive conventions are not evaluated for the assignment. You do not need to edit, revise a number of times, or attend in any special way to form or language. You should just write in a way that is clear to you. You are welcome to use bullet points. You do not need to write complete sentences or in paragraph form complete with transitions.

Homework should be submitted by 15:15 on the day it is due. There is no late homework accepted. All written assignments must be typed using 12 pt Times New Roman or 11 pt Arial font with 1" margins. All assignments must be send in one of the following formats: .doc, .docx, .txt, .tex, .pdf, .rtf, .odt, .dot. Remember to cite all sources and use APA guidelines for the citations. Homework must also include your name, class, date, and assignment.

### **1 Group Project**

For the second group project you will be designing your own experiment on one of the topics covered in class: 1. Truth Values, 2. Scope, 3. Quantification, 4. Entailments, 5. Synonymy, 6. Antonymy, and 7. Presupposition, In class on Thursday you will be brainstorming with your new group about the experiment you will run in the later third of the class. In order to properly prepare, write and email me the following: five (5) sentences sketching out a topic you are interested in and how you might design an experiment about the topics above. Describe the way that you will present the stimuli, what the participant will do, and what is the topic you are looking at. Also give an at least one example of stimulus and how you would ask for judgments. You are do to this exercise alone and then you will, with your new group, talk about it when everyone has their own sketch of experiment.

If you would like to do an experiment on a topic not listed above, then email me what you would like to do for approval before beginning this exercise.
