- Words(s) trigger
- Implication/Hidden meaning–message

Expectations

- Conversational Structure
- Using “unloaded” words

Some components of a conversation

- Turn-taking/pausing
- Adjacency pairs
- Routines

Adjacency Pairs

- Question → Answer
- Invitation → Acceptance
- Assessment → Disagreement
- Explanation → Concurrence

Adjacency Pairs

- Request → Granting
- Apology → Acceptance
- Summons → Acknowledgement

Routines

- Parts of the conversation that are relatively predictable due to common convention
 - Opening Sequences
 - Closing Sequences

Hidden Meaning

Meaning coming from what is said
(the words)

- Conventional implicature
- Presuppositional triggers

Hidden Meaning

Meaning coming from what is **not**
said (the rules)

- Conversational implicatures
- Violation of expectations
